






12. Victor Lake campground with CP coal train from Kaiser. Coal travels 700 miles from Sparwood to coast *en route* to Japan.







14. View over Okanagan Lake. Different geography: wide valleys, mild climate.




15. Okanagan Valley blossoms. Fruitgrowing region: apples, peaches, pears, cherries and grapes.


17. Grape bins. Vines and boxes. Seasonal workers needed to harvest crop.



20. Mara Lake. Lovely calm lakes. Resort area in summer.




21. Castlegar. Arrow Lake before dam. Site of irrigation project. Five dams to be built.

25. St. Agnes, Edgewood on the Arrow Lakes. Anglican/United/Roman Catholics use this church.



27. Duncan Dam creates Duncan Lake reservoir. Changes in environment and nature of land of great concern in Canada.




28. West Kootenay Power has five dams on the Kootenay River near Nelson. Produces power for industry at Trail and Kimberley over 100 miles away.




29. St. Saviour's Pro-Cathedral in Nelson. Interior during worship.




30. St. Saviour's Pro-Cathedral in Nelson. Baptism service.



35. S.S. Moyie at Kaslo. Old steamboats supplied the towns around the lakes until the 1940s.



36. Christ Church, Cranbrook. An older church with a new front.




37. Forest industry waste burner at Elko. Large burners like this are going out of style to avoid pollution.


38. Hereford cattle and cowboy at Athalmer. East Kootenay ranches raise beef on mountain grasses.

40. St. Margaret's Cemetery, Fernie. Many miners lose their lives mining near Fernie.




41. Hillcrest (Alberta). 110 men lie buried here from the 1903 Hillcrest disaster.

42. Overview of Fernie from Mt. Fernie. Narrow valleys, deep snow, hot summers.




43. Christ Church, Fernie. Built of brick after forest fire destroyed town in 1908.

46. Snow scene after morning worship. Mrs. Rowe, Mrs. Commons, Igor and Erika. It was 27 degrees below zero!



49. Primate Ted Scott on horseback. Everyone has to take their turn to please the farmers!




50. Newgate, near Fernie. Small house communion. This is not an uncommon event in rural places, especially in winter where there is no church building. Rev. Ray Bray.

52. Christ Church, Fernie. Thanksgiving display with produce of mines and forest as well as vegetables and fruit.



53. Kootenay National Park. Wildlife preserve on Kimpton Creek Trail. Vacation spot and protection for animals in the mountains.




54. Upper Arrow Lakes. Nakusp to Revelstoke. Gravel roads are common – some clergy drive up to 20,000 miles a year on such roads.

56. Columbia Lake. Beautiful views make the travel very easy to take!




57. Long valleys filled with lakes. In the early days, there was much travel by boat.





of Donald closed up.




59. Altar panels at St. David's, Celista. Beauty of wildflowers captured in the frontals.




60. Interior of St. Mary's, Sorrento. Hand-carved woodwork by a local artist.
